It's been almost 40 years since a coalition of Baltimore activists established a medical clinic in a rowhouse at the corner of 30th Street and Greenmount Avenue. Our founders started the clinic – the first of its kind on the East Coast – as a sister facility to the Berkeley, California Free Clinic. Today, we employ the most committed doctors, nurses and medical staff anywhere. For the past eight years, health care costs in Maryland have increased faster than wages. Being uninsured means living one illness or injury away from financial and personal ruin. But it also means that, when you do get sick or injured, those illnesses and injuries are usually worse. All these years later, we're still advocates for health care for all.</p>
