

2025-2026 CURRICULUM OVERVIEW 60-Credit Hybrid Program

The University of Maryland Baltimore's 60-credit Hybrid Program integrates in-person, hybrid, and online coursework with hands-on practicum experience. Students start with a 27-credit foundation curriculum, progressing to a 33-credit advanced curriculum tailored to their chosen concentration of Clinical or Leadership, Policy, and Social Change.

FOUNDATION CURRICULUM:

The 27-credit Foundation Curriculum provides educational and skill development in the values, concepts, and processes at the core of social work practice. Coursework in human behavior and the social environment, social work practice, social policy, structural oppression, and research help students develop a problem-solving framework with individuals, families, groups, communities, and organizations. Students also complete a two-semester practicum, taken two days a week for (16) hours per week, in a social service placement. Practicum is typically on Tuesdays and Thursdays, unless otherwise specified by the Practicum agency. Students enroll in a virtual 90-minute monthly seminar while completing foundation practicum. Practicum and seminar allow students to apply the knowledge, skills, and objectives from foundation coursework to real-world practice.

ADVANCED CURRICULUM:

All students complete the remaining 33 credits of their program based on their selected Concentration (requirements listed below). Students take an advanced policy course and four 3-credit methods courses in their selected concentration.

Advanced Practicum

The advanced practicum setting is determined by the concentration, which students declare on their advanced practicum application. Advanced practicum is two consecutive semesters scheduled typically during regular business hours on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, unless otherwise specified by the agency. Students have the option of a two-day a week advanced extended practicum that runs through July. Students who choose an extended practicum graduate in July.



Program Concentrations

Students are required to select a concentration (**Clinical** or **Leadership, Policy, & Social Change**). Students can select a secondary concentration. Those who select a primary and secondary concentration are placed in their advanced practicum based upon their primary concentration. A secondary concentration will expose the student to some of the other concentration's content through two courses. Each concentration has specific course requirements, which are identified below.
