<b>Alumni Association Scholarship</b>	Several scholarships will be awarded from the Alumni Association's Scholarship Fund. These scholarships are for continuing students (going into a second year or the advanced curriculum in the fall 2023 semester) who have completed at least 12 credits at the School of Social Work.	Please upload a personal statement that addresses the following: volunteer and work experience, reasons for pursuing the social work profession, and your career plans. Submissions must be in .doc or .pdf format, 300 words or less, double-spaced, and in 12-point font.
<b>Brittani "Bri" Brunn Memorial Scholarship</b>	The Brittani "Bri" Brunn Memorial Scholarship will be awarded to an Advanced MSW student pursuing or furthering a career with a clinical concentration in Behavioral Health. The recipient will be selected by a staff and faculty committee based on merit and financial need, as well as an essay describing their future behavioral health plans. Preference will be given to students that have an interest in suicide prevention.	Please upload a personal statement that describes your experience and future plans in the field of behavioral health. Preference will be given to students that have an interest in suicide prevention. Submissions must be in .doc or .pdf format, 300 words or less, double-spaced, and in 12-point font.
<b>Camille Baudot Wheeler Scholarship</b>	The Camille Baudot Wheeler Scholarship will be given to an advanced-year macro MSW student. The recipient will be selected by a staff and faculty committee based on merit as well as an essay describing their interest in policy studies and future plans.	Please submit an essay describing your interest in policy studies and future plans. Personal statements must be in .doc or .pdf format, 300 words or less, and must be double-spaced using 1-inch margins and 12-point type.
<b>Oliver Harris Scholarship</b>	The Dr. Oliver C. Harris Scholarship for the Prevention of Intimate Partner Violence will be given to an advanced year MSW student. The recipient will be selected by a staff and faculty committee based on merit as well as an essay describing their experiences in and future commitment to preventing intimate partner violence along with their career plans.	Please submit an essay describing your experiences in and future commitment to preventing intimate partner violence along with your career plans. Personal statements must be in .doc or .pdf format, 300 words or less, and must be double-spaced using 1-inch margins and 12-point type.
<b>Jean M. Dockhorn and Anne P. Hahn Scholarship</b>	The Jean M. Dockhorn and Anne P. Hahn Scholarship will be given to an advanced year MSW student. The recipient will be selected by a staff and faculty committee based on merit as well as an essay describing their commitment in the following areas: hospital social work, a community health care organization or social work/public health.	Please submit an essay describing your experience and commitment in 300 words or less in the following three areas: hospital social work, a community health care organization, or social work/public health. Essays must be submitted as a word doc or pdf, 12 point font, and double spaced.
<b>Julie Oktay Scholarship for Oncology Social Work</b>	The Julie and Erol Oktay Scholarship will be given to an Advanced MSW student. The recipient will be selected by a staff and faculty committee based on merit as well as an essay describing their experiences and interest in oncology social work.	We are looking for essays that describe the student applicant's experiences and career plans in the field of oncology social work. Personal statements must be in .doc or .pdf format, 300 words or less, and must be double-spaced using 1-inch margins and 12-point type.
<b>Richard W. Friedman Scholarship for Juvenile Justice or Criminal Justice</b>	The Richard Friedman Scholarship will be given to an advanced-year MSW student. The recipient will be selected by a staff and faculty committee based on merit as well as an essay describing their plans to pursue a career in juvenile justice or criminal justice.	Please submit an essay describing your plans to pursue a career in juvenile justice or criminal justice. Personal statements must be in .doc or .pdf format, 300 words or less, and must be double-spaced using 1-inch margins and 12-point type.
<b>Sylvia Miller Nathanson Scholarship</b>	The Sylvia Miller Nathanson Scholarship will be given to a non-traditional student. Non-traditional is defined in this case as meeting at least one of the following characteristics: delayed enrollment into graduate education; attends school part-time while working full-time; has dependents other than a spouse; or is a single parent. The recipient will be selected by a staff and faculty committee based on merit as well as an essay describing one these characteristics.	We are looking for essays that describe the non-traditional student applicant's experiences and career plans in the field of social work. Personal statements must be in .doc or .pdf format, 300 words or less, and must be double-spaced using 1-inch margins and 12-point type.
<b>Terrie Alexander Memorial Scholarship</b>	The Terrie Alexander Memorial Scholarship will be given to an Advanced MSW student pursuing or furthering a career in Substance Use Intervention or Prevention (preference is given to students in field placements at the Terrie Alexander Intensive Outpatient Clinic and/or Forensics Social Work (Defense Based)). The recipient will be selected by a staff and faculty committee based on merit, financial need as well as an essay describing their future substance use intervention or prevention and/or forensics social work plans.	Please submit an essay describing your interest in substance use intervention or prevention and/or forensics social work and your experiences in various aspects of the field. Personal statements must be in .doc or .pdf format, 300 words or less, and must be double-spaced using 1-inch margins and 12-point type.
<b>Woodside Foundation Scholarship in Financial Social Work</b>	The Woodside Foundation Scholarship Endowment in Financial Social Work will be given to an Advanced Standing or continuing MSW student. These scholarships are for clinical and macro students who are interested in financial social work, including working with individuals, families and communities to build financial capability and assets; addressing poverty, economic inequality, and the racial wealth divide; and advancing economic justice.	Please submit an essay describing your interest in financial social work and your experiences in various aspects of the field, including asset building, family economic stability, income inequality and poverty. Personal statements must be in .doc or .pdf format, 300 words or less, and must be double-spaced using 1-inch margins and 12-point type.
