



HOW YOU CAN HELP FSWI'S MISSION OF ADVANCING ECONOMIC STABILITY

OUTREACH:

- Promote FSWI to prospective students and social workers in your network.
- Share information about FSWI Continuing Professional Education course offerings.
- Promote FSWI to agencies and human services organizations where you work/volunteer.

GENERAL SUPPORT FOR FSWI:

- Designate a gift to the FSWI Fund or FSW Endowment during the Annual Alumni Giving appeal.
- Designate a gift to the FSWI Fund or FSW Endowment during March's Social Work Month appeal.

SUPPORT CURRENT MSW STUDENTS:

- **Scholarships for MSW Students**
 - Any amount supplements the existing Woodside Foundation Scholarship Endowment in Financial Social Work awarded to a qualifying student.
 - \$2,000 funds a current year FSWI scholarship for a First or Second Year student (5 yrs. min.).
 - \$50,000 endows an annual \$2,000 FSWI scholarship for a First or Second Year student.
- **Fellowships for Second/Advanced Year MSW Students**
 - \$13,000 funds a one-time current year FSWI fellowship, supporting a \$10,000 field stipend and \$3,000 for field supervision.
 - \$300,000 endows an annual FSWI fellowship, supporting a \$10,000 field stipend and \$3,000 for field supervision.
- **Stipends for Students**
 - \$6,000 funds a Research Scholar to work on FSWI research and related projects.
 - \$10,500 funds a Doctoral student to work on FSWI research and related projects.

SUPPORT COMMUNITY PRACTITIONERS:

- **Continuing Professional Education**
 - Any amount supplements the existing FSWI Fund to increase access to professional development with reduced attendance fees for social workers.
 - \$600 underwrites the development of a new half-day FSW CPE course.
 - \$1,200 underwrites the development of a new full-day FSW CPE course.
- **Financial Social Work Practitioner Training**
 - Support a full (\$5,000) or half-day (\$2,500) employee training on FSW tools and interventions on site at an agency or human services organization.

SUPPORT RESEARCH AND BEST PRACTICES DISSEMINATION:

- Engage the School's nationally recognized faculty for grant-funded research and evaluation projects.
