MARYLAND OBLIGORS BY AGE OF OLDEST CASE JURISDICTIONAL PROFILES, JULY 2023

This document includes 25 profiles describing obligors—parents who owe support—in the public child support program in Maryland and its 24 jurisdictions, and the findings replicate those found in this report: Maryland's Child Support Caseload, July 2023: Examining Obligors by Age of Oldest Case. Each profile is based on a random sample of obligors with active child support cases in July 2023 and provides information about obligor demographics, case characteristics, and support obligations and payments. Most findings are segmented by the age of obligors' oldest case according to the following time periods:

- 1. **Less than 5 years ago** between August 2018 and July 2023;
- 2. **5 to 14 years ago** between August 2009 and July 2018;
- 3. **15 to 24 years ago** between August 1999 and July 2009;
- 4. **25 years ago or more**, prior to August 1999.

Methods

Population

This report uses a stratified random sample of obligors—parents who owe support—with active child support cases in July 2023. There were 137,240 unique obligors with active cases in July 2023, and the sample includes 17,802 unique obligors (13%). The sample is stratified by jurisdiction with a 95% confidence interval and a 3% margin of error. Sample sizes for each jurisdiction are provided in the respective profile.

Data Sources

Study findings are based on analyses of administrative data maintained by the State of Maryland including the Child Support Management System (CSMS) for child support data and BEACON for employment and earnings data. Additional information on these sources and their limitations can be found in the main report.

Definitions & Timeframes

- Current support represents the monthly obligation that obligors are ordered to pay to support their children.
 Each brief examines the annual amount due and paid between July 2022 and June 2023.
- Past-due support (arrears) is unpaid current support obligations (i.e. debt).
 Each profile examines the arrears balance in July 2023 and any payments made between July 2022 and June 2023.
 - Custodian-owed arrears are arrears owed directly to the custodial parent or custodian.
 - State-owed arrears are arrears owed to the state for reimbursement of cash assistance benefits or foster care services provided to the custodial family.

KEY FINDINGS BY JURISDICTION

Age of Oldest Case

Most obligors across the state had their first case open 5 to 14 years ago (43%) or 15 to 24 years ago (28%). About one in seven had their first case open in the past 5 years (14%) or 25 years ago or more (15%).

- ➤ In four jurisdictions, obligors whose first case opened recently were slightly more common than the state average, including Charles (18%), Calvert (18%), Cecil (19%), and Harford (19%) counties.
- ➤ Baltimore City (32%) and Dorchester County (25%) were more likely than other jurisdictions to have obligors whose first case opened 25 years ago or more.

The remaining findings highlight jurisdictional variation between obligors with the *most recent* cases (opened less than 5 years ago) and the *oldest* cases (opened 25 years ago or more).

Case Characteristics

Most (75%) obligors across the state had one case, though this was more common among obligors with more recent cases (96%) than those with older cases (64%).

- > In every jurisdiction, more than 90% of obligors with recent cases had one child support case.
- The percentage of obligors with older cases who had one case ranged from half in St. Mary's (49%) and Dorchester (50%) counties to 88% in Garrett County.

Obligor Demographics

The percentage of obligors who identify as Black decreased between those with the oldest cases and those with the more recent cases (82% to 59%), while the percentage who identify as White (16% to 30%) or Hispanic/Latinx (1% to 9%) increased.

- The percentage of Black obligors decreased in every jurisdiction, with very large decreases in smaller jurisdictions such as Talbot (81% to 33%) and Queen Anne's (69% to 22%) counties. Despite declines, most obligors with recent cases identify as Black in larger jurisdictions, such as Baltimore City (88%) and Prince George's County (82%).
- ➤ All but three jurisdictions (Prince George's, Charles, and Frederick) had a larger percentage of obligors who identify as White, with the largest increase occurring in Queen Anne's (30% to 74%) and Calvert (30% to 72%) counties.
- ➤ In 20 jurisdictions, the percentage of obligors who identify as Hispanic/Latinx increased, with the largest increases occurring in Montgomery (6% to 31%), Frederick (3% to 15%), and Prince George's (1% to 12%) counties.

Obligor Employment

In Maryland, the percentage of obligors employed and their median earnings were consistent between those with the most recent cases (60%; \$30,874) and those with the oldest cases (61%; \$32,475). However, this pattern varied substantially across jurisdictions.

- Employment among obligors with older cases was substantially higher in Montgomery (64% vs. 46%) and Somerset (64% vs. 49%) counties. On the other hand, obligors with older cases were about 10 to 25 percentage points less likely to be employed than obligors with recent cases in 10 jurisdictions.
- Median earnings were \$40,000 or more for obligors with older cases in six counties (Baltimore, Caroline, Cecil, Garrett, Harford, and Howard), and in three counties for obligors with recent cases (Calvert, Carroll, and Howard).

Current Support Owed in the Previous Year

The percentage of obligors who owed current support was substantially higher among those with recent cases (67%) compared to those with older cases (32%). The average amount owed was also higher (\$6,943 vs. \$5,249).

- ➤ In every jurisdiction, obligors with recent cases were more likely to owe current support compared to those with older cases, ranging from 10 percentage points in Washington County (74% vs. 64%) to nearly 60 percentage points in Carroll County (87% vs. 28%).
- ➤ The median current support obligation was also higher among obligors with recent cases, ranging from 1% higher in Baltimore City (\$4,924 vs. \$4,859) to 136% higher in Cecil County (\$7,713 vs. \$3,266).

Current Support Payments in the Previous Year

About eight in 10 obligors made a current support payment among both recent cases (81%) and older cases (80%). However, the average amount paid was 31% higher among obligors with recent cases (\$4,573) compared to those with older cases (\$3,495).

- > The vast majority (90% or more) of obligors with older cases made a payment in three counties (Garrett, Montgomery, and Somerset); this was also true of obligors with recent cases in three counties (Allegany, Calvert, and Talbot).
- ➤ In all but four jurisdictions, average payments were higher among obligors with recent cases compared to those with older cases, ranging from 4% higher in Howard County (\$5,470 vs. \$5,273) to 98% higher in Charles County (\$7,473 vs. \$3,779).

Arrears Owed in July 2023

Obligors with older cases were more likely to owe arrears than those with recent cases (75% vs. 48%). Likewise, obligors with older cases had a median arrears balance more than double that of obligors with recent cases (\$15,650 vs. \$6,200).

- ➤ In all jurisdictions, the percentage of obligors owing arrears was higher for those with older cases compared to recent cases, ranging from 6 percentage points in Washington County (64% vs. 58%) to 54 percentage points in Cecil County (89% vs. 35%).
- ➤ The median arrears balance exceeded \$20,000 for obligors with older cases in three counties (Anne Arundel, Carroll, and Howard) while the lowest balance was under \$8,000 in three counties (Caroline, Garrett, and Somerset).
- Among obligors with recent cases, the median arrears balance was highest at nearly \$9,000 in three counties (Cecil, Baltimore, and Prince George's) and was lowest in Allegany, Dorchester, and Kent counties, at less than \$3,000.

Arrears Payments in the Previous Year

The percentage of obligors that made an arrears payment was higher among those with older cases (71%) compared to recent cases (60%). The median amount paid was also higher for obligors with older cases (\$923) compared to recent cases (\$576).


- ➤ In 13 jurisdictions, obligors with older cases were more likely to make an arrears payment than those with recent cases, including Worcester County (84% vs. 52%) and Baltimore City (77% vs. 47%).
- In the remaining 11 jurisdictions, obligors with recent cases were more likely to make an arrears payment than those with older cases, including Dorchester County (83% vs. 64%).
- ➤ In all but two jurisdictions, median payments were higher for obligors with older cases compared to recent cases, ranging from 9% higher in Cecil County (\$887 vs. \$816) to more than three times higher in Baltimore City (\$799 vs. \$197).

Custodian-owed versus State-owed Arrears in July 2023

Most (70%) obligors owed arrears only to the custodial parent, though obligors with older cases were less likely to owe to the custodial parent only compared to those with recent cases (57% vs. 84%). Comparatively, obligors with older cases were more likely to owe arrears to the state only compared to those with recent cases (11% vs. 8%).

- Similar to the state, obligors with older cases were more likely to owe arrears to the state only in 10 jurisdictions, including Baltimore County (14% vs. 3%).
- ➤ However, in 12 jurisdictions, obligors with recent cases were more likely to owe arrears to the state only compared to those with older cases, including Garrett County (27% vs. 4%) and Somerset County (30% vs. 10%).




















































