TEMPORARY CASH ASSISTANCE: 2020 JURISDICTIONAL SNAPSHOTS

This document includes individual snapshots for each of Maryland's 24 jurisdictions as well as for the state. The snapshots summarize data from Maryland's Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA) program. Each snapshot is two-sided: the front is based on the recent update of the annual *Life on Welfare* report and provides a brief look at every family in a jurisdiction who received TCA in state fiscal year (SFY) 2020 (July 2019 to June 2020). The data in this section includes the first three months of the COVID-19 pandemic (April to June 2020), which resulted in a 43% increase in Maryland's TCA caseload. Where relevant, the snapshot examines families who came onto the TCA program before and after the start of the pandemic.

The back of each snapshot is based on the 2020 update of the annual <u>Life after Welfare</u> report. It provides a summary of a sample of families who left TCA between SFYs 2013 and 2019 (July 2012 to June 2019). The data in this section provides jurisdictions with a final baseline of the characteristics of families who left TCA before the start of the pandemic.

Methods

Population and Sample

The first page of each snapshot provides information about TCA cases in SFY 2020. These analyses examine the population of TCA cases that received at least one month of TCA in SFY 2020. Families are sorted into pre-pandemic and pandemic cohorts based on their first month of TCA receipt in SFY 2020. Families whose first month of receipt occurred between July 2019 and March 2020 are included in the pre-pandemic cohort. Families whose first month of receipt was between April and June 2020 are included in the pandemic cohort. Demographic and employment analyses are only for adult recipients, so payees who were not recipients are excluded. Adult recipients who were not payees, such as the second parent in a two-parent family, are included. In total, there were 32,532 unique TCA cases statewide in SFY 2020 and 26,453 adult recipients.

The second page of each snapshot provides information about TCA cases that closed between SFYs 2013 and 2019. Whereas the analysis on the first page of each snapshot includes the entire population of active cases, the analysis of TCA leavers uses a stratified random sample of cases that closed between July 2012 and June 2019. Cases had to be closed for a least two months in order to be included. If a case had more than one closure during the study period, one of the closures was randomly selected for inclusion in the study. The sample was stratified by jurisdiction to ensure both small and large jurisdictions were appropriately represented in the data and that the sample yielded valid statewide and jurisdictional-level results. More information about the sampling strategy can be found in the *Life after Welfare* 2020 update. The final statewide sample for this analysis included 19,041 TCA cases and 16,001 adult recipients.

Data Sources

Data for the snapshots come from several sources. Information regarding individual- and case-level demographics and program participation for TCA families comes from the Client Automated Resource and Eligibility System (CARES), including data on Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Transitional Support Services (TSS) participation. Earnings and employment information is from the Maryland Automated Benefits System (MABS). MABS data accounts for approximately 91% of all Maryland civilian employment; however, the data does have some limitations. MABS does not contain data on certain types of employment, such as self-employment, independent contractors, and informal employment. MABS also has no information on employment outside of Maryland. Because several jurisdictions in Maryland have very high rates of out-of-state employment, earnings and employment rates provided in each snapshot come from the <u>U.S. Census Bureau</u> (using the 2014 – 2018 American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates for Sex of Workers by Place of Work—State and County Level (B08007) table). Industry of employment is identified through <u>NAICS codes</u>. NAICS codes are used by the federal government to classify businesses into broad, general categories for data and analyses purposes. Data in the snapshots use 3-digit NAICS codes.

In addition to CARES and MABS, the second page of each snapshot includes data for child support, obtained from the Child Support Enforcement System (CSES). Data on Medical Assistance participation comes from the Maryland Department of Health through a data-sharing agreement with the Maryland Department of Human Services.

DEFINITIONS AND TERMINOLOGY

NAICS DEFINITIONS

- Administrative and Support Industry (NAICS-561): Organizations that support day-to-day operations—clerical, cleaning, and general management activities—and temporary employment services.
- Education (NAICS-611): Instruction or training services such as K-12 schools, community colleges, universities, and training centers.
- Food & Beverage Retail (NAICS-445): Retail stores that sell food and beverages, such as grocery stores and specialty drink stores.
- General Retail (NAICS-452): Department stores and other general merchandise stores.
- Nursing Homes (NAICS-623): Organizations that provide health and social services such as nursing homes, substance abuse facilities, or residential care for the mentally ill.
- Outpatient Healthcare (NAICS-621): Outpatient healthcare facilities, medical and diagnostic laboratories, and home healthcare services.
- Professional & Technical (NAICS-541): Organizations specializing in legal advice, book-keeping, computer services, or consulting services among others.
- Restaurants (NAICS-722): Full-service or fast food restaurants as well as caterers and mobile food services.
- Social Assistance (NAICS 624): Organizations that provide a wide variety of social assistance, including personal and home care, child care, and other social and human services.


CASE CLOSURE REASONS

- Customer requested closure: Family elected to discontinue TCA benefits.
- Did not maintain eligibility: Family did not maintain eligibility, which can include not submitting required documentation to demonstrate continued need.
- Did not reapply: Family did not recertify their eligibility for TCA when required.
- Income above limit: Family's earned income from employment or unearned income from child support, disability payments, or other sources exceeds the income eligibility requirements.
- Ineligible: Family did not meet the TCA program's eligibility criteria.
- Non-compliance with the work requirement: Work-eligible adult recipient(s) on a case did not participate in the approved work activities required to maintain TCA benefits.

KEY DEFINITIONS

- Economic Recovery Cohort (TCA case closures): Families who left the TCA program between July 2012 and June 2016.
- Economic Stability Cohort (TCA case closures): Families who left the TCA program between July 2016 and June 2019.
- Median: The middle value of a set of numbers. One can find the median by arranging all values from lowest to highest and selecting the midpoint value. Extreme values do not affect the median, which is why it is sometimes preferred over the mean.
- Medical Assistance: An umbrella term for Maryland's Medicaid program and the Maryland Children's Health Program (MCHP).
- New to TCA (TCA caseload): Cases in which no adult recipient on the case received TCA benefits prior to SFY 2020. If at least one adult recipient on the case received TCA benefits prior to SFY 2020, the case is not considered new.
- Out-of-state employment: Workers 16 and older who reported working outside of Maryland. Information comes from the American Community Survey, conducted by the <u>U.S. Census Bureau</u>.
- Pandemic Cohort (TCA caseload): Families whose first month of TCA receipt in SFY 2020 was between April and June 2020.
- Pre-pandemic Cohort (TCA caseload): Families whose first month of TCA receipt in SFY 2020 was between July 2019 and March 2020.
- SNAP: An acronym for the federal <u>Supplemental Nutrition Assistance</u> <u>Program.</u>
- TSS: An acronym for Maryland's <u>Transitional Support Services</u> benefit. TSS assists Maryland families with their transition from TCA to the workforce by providing up to three consecutive months of cash benefits after exit.



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

TCA Case Closures, SFYs 2013-2019



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

Calvert County TCA Caseload, SFY 2020





TCA Case Closures, SFYs 2013-2019







Cecil County TCA Caseload, SFY 2020



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

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

Charles County TCA Caseload, SFY 2020



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

Frederick County TCA Caseload, SFY 2020









TCA Case Closures, SFYs 2013-2019





Harford County TCA Caseload, SFY 2020







TCA Case Closures. SFYs 2013-2019



Montgomery County TCA Caseload, SFY 2020





TCA Case Closures, SFYs 2013-2019





Prince George's County TCA Caseload, SFY 2020



















Talbot County TCA Case Closures. SFYs 2013-2019



Washington County TCA Caseload, SFY 2020








Wicomico County TCA Caseload, SFY 2020

Wicomico County TCA Case Closures, SFYs 2013-2019






