

TEMPORARY CASH ASSISTANCE: 2021 JURISDICTIONAL SNAPSHOTS

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This document includes individual snapshots for each of Maryland's 24 jurisdictions as well as for the state. The snapshots summarize data from Maryland's Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA) program. Each snapshot is two-sided: the front is based on the recent update of the annual *Life on Welfare* report and provides a brief look at every family in a jurisdiction who received TCA in state fiscal year (SFY) 2021 (July 2020 to June 2021). Families in SFY 2021 endured the economic turbulence caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, including high unemployment rates. As a result, TCA utilization was elevated compared to just a few years prior.

The back of each snapshot is based on the 2021 update of the annual <u>Life after Welfare</u> report. It provides a summary of a sample of families who left TCA between July 2016 and December 2020. The data in this section provide a general examination of families' characteristics after they exited the TCA program. Where appropriate, this section examines data by three cohorts that align with changes in the economy: (1) the economic stability cohort, which includes cases that closed between July 2016 and March 2019, and for which there is at least one year of follow-up data unaffected by the pandemic; (2) the pre-pandemic cohort, which includes cases that closed between April 2019 and March 2020, the year leading up to the pandemic, and; (3) the pandemic cohort, which includes cases that closed between April 2020 and December 2020, during the height of the pandemic.

Methods

Population and Sample

The first page of each snapshot provides information about the population of TCA cases that received at least one month of benefits in SFY 2021. Demographic and employment analyses are only for adult recipients, so payees who were not recipients are excluded. Adult recipients who were not payees, such as the second parent in a two-parent family, are included. In total, there were 32,561 unique TCA cases statewide in SFY 2021 and 27,416 adult recipients.

The second page of each snapshot provides information about TCA cases that closed between July 2016 and December 2020. Whereas the analysis on the first page of each snapshot includes the entire population of active cases in SFY 2021, the analysis of TCA leavers uses a stratified random sample of cases that closed between July 2016 and December 2020. Cases had to be closed for a least two months in order to be included, and if a case had more than one closure during the study period, one of the closures was randomly selected for inclusion in the study. The sample was stratified by cohort and jurisdiction to ensure both small and large jurisdictions were appropriately represented in each cohort and that the sample yielded valid statewide and jurisdictional-level results. More information about the sampling strategy can be found in the *Life after Welfare* 2021 update. The final statewide sample for this analysis included 24,031 TCA cases and 19,675 adult recipients.

Data Sources

Data for the snapshots come from several sources. The Eligibility and Enrollment (E&E) system and the Client Automated Resources and Eligibility System (CARES) are the administrative data systems for safety net programs managed by the Maryland Department of Human Services (DHS). CARES was operational between March 1998 and November 2021. The migration to E&E began in April 2021 and all jurisdictions were migrated to E&E by November 2021. Both E&E and CARES provide individual- and case-level program participation data for Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA), Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), and other services as well as demographic data on participants. Due to the transition from CARES to E&E, there is limited data for cases whose first month of TCA benefits occurred between April and June 2021.¹

Earnings and employment information is from the Maryland Automated Benefits System (MABS). MABS data account for approximately 91% of all Maryland civilian employment but do not contain data on certain types of employment, such as self-employment, independent contractors, and informal employment. MABS also has no information on employment outside of Maryland. Because several jurisdictions in Maryland have very high rates of out-of-state employment, earnings and employment are more likely to be understated in some jurisdictions compared to others. Out-of-state employment rates provided in each snapshot come from the <u>U.S. Census Bureau</u> (using the 2014 – 2019 American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates for Sex of Workers by Place of Work—State and County Level (B08007) table). Industry of employment is identified through <u>NAICS codes</u>, which are used by the federal government to classify businesses into broad, general categories for data and analyses purposes. Data in the snapshots use 3-digit NAICS codes.

The second page of each snapshot also includes child support data obtained from the Child Support Enforcement System (CSES), and data on Medical Assistance participation obtained from the Maryland Department of Health through a data-sharing agreement with DHS.

¹ The counties that migrated from CARES to E&E during these months included Allegany, Anne Arundel, Calvert, Carroll, Charles, Frederick, Garrett, Kent, St. Mary's, and Washington. Caseload counts for these counties include data from both databases, but additional analyses exclude cases that migrated to E&E. Only information on the first page of each snapshot is impacted.

DEFINITIONS AND TERMINOLOGY

NAICS DEFINITIONS

- Administrative and Support Industry (NAICS-561): Organizations that support day-to-day operations—clerical, cleaning, and general management activities—and temporary employment services.
- Education (NAICS-611): Instruction or training services such as K-12 schools, community colleges, universities, and training centers.
- Food & Beverage Retail (NAICS-445): Retail stores that sell food and beverages, such as grocery stores and specialty drink stores.
- General Retail (NAICS-452): Department stores and other general merchandise stores.
- Nursing Homes (NAICS-623): Organizations that provide health and social services such as nursing homes, substance abuse facilities, or residential care for the mentally ill.
- Outpatient Healthcare (NAICS-621): Outpatient healthcare facilities, medical and diagnostic laboratories, and home healthcare services.
- Restaurants (NAICS-722): Full-service or fast food restaurants as well as caterers and mobile food services.
- Social Assistance (NAICS-624): Organizations that provide a wide variety of social assistance, including personal and home care, child care, and other social and human services.
- Warehousing and Storage (NAICS-493): Establishments primarily engaged in operating merchandise warehousing and storage facilities.


CASE CLOSURE REASONS

- Customer requested closure: Family elected to discontinue TCA benefits.
- Did not maintain eligibility: Family did not maintain eligibility, which can include not submitting required documentation to demonstrate continued need.
- Did not reapply: Family did not recertify their eligibility for TCA when required.
- Income above limit: Family's earned income from employment or unearned income from child support, disability payments, or other sources exceeds the income eligibility requirements.
- Ineligible: Family did not meet the TCA program's eligibility criteria.
- Noncompliance with the work requirement: Work-eligible adult recipient(s) on a case did not participate in the approved work activities required to maintain TCA benefits.

KEY DEFINITIONS

- Child Support Pass-Through: Maryland policy in which active TCA families receive a portion of current child support payments.
- Economic Stability Cohort: Families who left the TCA program between July 2016 and March 2019.
- Educational Attainment: High school completion includes adults with either a diploma or GED. Post-secondary education includes adults who completed college or obtained other credentials.
- Median: The middle value of a set of numbers. One can find the median by arranging all values from lowest to highest and selecting the midpoint value. Extreme values do not affect the median, which is why it is sometimes preferred over the mean.
- Medical Assistance: An umbrella term for Maryland's Medicaid program and the Maryland Children's Health Program (MCHP).
- New to TCA: Cases that had not received TCA benefits prior to SFY 2021.
- Out-of-state employment: Workers 16 and older who reported working outside of Maryland. Information comes from the American Community Survey, conducted by the <u>U.S. Census Bureau</u>.
- Pandemic Cohort: Families who left the TCA program between April 2020 and December 2020.
- Pre-pandemic Cohort: Families who left the TCA program between April 2019 and March 2020.
- SNAP: An acronym for the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.
- Transitional Support Services (TSS): A Maryland benefit that assists Maryland families with their transition from TCA to the workforce by providing up to three consecutive months of cash benefits after exit.







TCA Caseload, SFY 2021











Employment among Adult Recipients





TCA Caseload, SFY 2021







TCA Caseload, SFY 2021









TCA Caseload, SFY 2021








Employment among Adult Recipients






