Dr. Nadine Finigan-Carr: Sworn in as new Commissioner on Baltimore City's Office of Civil Rights Community Relations Commission

On August 06, 2018, Dr. Nadine Finigan-Carr was officially sworn in as Commissioner, for Baltimore City's Community Relations Commission, Office of Civil Rights. With this appointment, Dr. Finigan-Carr will serve the people of Baltimore City and investigate claims of discrimination by enforcing the laws that protect them. The Baltimore Community Relations Commission combats unlawful discrimination in employment, public accommodation, housing, education and health and welfare services.



WHAT IS PARI?



PARI, **Prevention of Adolescent Risks Initiative** is one of the Ruth Young Center for Families and Children's newest initiatives created to increase visibility and knowledge to address adolescent health issues. With a focus on the social determinants of health, risks, and protective factors, PARI serves to:

- Increase awareness of social behavioral health risks for adolescents, such as child trafficking, and teen pregnancy so that youth receive comprehensive, trauma-informed care through capacity building of service providers and targeting existing services and resources.
- 2. Enhance partnerships and collaborations for information sharing and data collection at the national, state, and local levels.
- 3. Increase the capacity, through advocacy and training, of child welfare and juvenile services professionals, health care providers, researchers, policymakers, and others to appropriately and effectively prevent, identify and respond to adolescent health needs.
